e) Question Time

Question raised regarding the Union's current deficit and whether the Union is concerned.

The UQ Union Treasurer responded that the current deficit is approximately \$5,000, which is entirely manageable. He added that the business trading arm is doing well and wages are under control.

The President added that some programs and portfolios won't spend all of their allocated funding.

Question raised regarding progress on the Schonell theatre.

The UQ Union Secretary responded that in the last month funding negotiations have been underway. Student feedback and submissions have indicated that students are hoping the use of the space for cultural productions will be retained.

Question raised by student, Kurt Tucker, regarding the National Union of Students Conference and whether the Union helped to fund the attendance of four delegates.

UQ Union President responded that the question has been answered in the previous council meeting. She explained that the Union paid for flights on Tiger Air, subsidised housing and conference registration.

Question raised by student, Kurt Tucker, regarding why the flights were booked for the day prior to the beginning of the conference.



The UQ Union President responded that by choosing earlier flights, the tickets were at a lower price.

Question raised regarding the Council of International Students Australia conference and any ideas or strategies that came out of the conference which may be applied at the University of Queensland.

The Postgraduate Officer, Roberto Fragoso, responded that the idea of utilising state funding and ways to participate in initiatives regarding transport could be considered.

Student, Kurt Tucker, moved a motion regarding the process of sending delegates to conferences of the NUS. He was advocating for a proportionate representation across campus political groups.

Question regarding whether the mover intends for councillors to be sent to the conference.

The mover of the motion clarified that he is suggesting that council elects the delegates.

Discussion was held regarding regulatory amendments pertaining to the Abilities Collective, who can hold candidacy for the position of Abilities Officer and who can vote for those positions.

Concerns were raised regarding the wording of the regulatory amendments. This was primarily with respect to the allowance for candidates to identify as being (dis)abled and whether that could become confusing for candidates and voters to navigate and interpret.

It was raised that one reason for the wording is that it allows for people who have a mental illness, whether diagnosed or otherwise, to identify as having a (dis)ability.

It was raised that the wording is supported by the community and is based on an honesty system.

It was raised that the Abilities Collective chose the wording themselves and, in practice, Council does not often reject the wording of autonomous groups.



An Abilities Collective representative raised that the collective could be contacted regarding the wording in order to consider it further.

It was raised that the regulatory amendments could still pass at this meeting and once the Abilities Collective has considered concerns raised, they could advise council on any further amendments at a later meeting.

- a) Only students who identify as being (dis)abled may stand for the position of Abilities Officer.

81A.4 The Abilities Officer is delegated the same responsibilities as the Abilities Collective

81A.5 The Abilities Officer may only exercise the powers of the Union with respect to those responsibilities in accordance with R83.

Discussion moved to college voting.

A letter from the Head of Colleges, Stephen Foley, was discussed. The letter explained that the Colleges no longer permit college voting and want the provision removed from the UQ Union Regulations.

Question raised regarding whether Council can extend an invitation to Stephen Foley to attend a meeting of UQ Union Council in order to speak to members regarding his request.

The UQ Union President explained that Stephen Foley was very clear on his position and the colleges will refuse to allow voting on their property. She added that if this rule remains in the Regulations, the UQ Union Annual Elections could be invalidated.

The colleges officer raised that the Heads of College have not been clear on why they want voting removed and added that it is not what the students want.

It was suggested that some colleges have indicated support for College voting, the position is no longer unanimous amongst the colleges, and that perhaps some of the locations could be retained.

The President responded that the Regulations can't favour just two or three colleges over the rest. She added that the Union has been advised that the colleges would move as a block to remove voting from colleges and if that has changed, it has not been communicated formally.

It was raised that the regulations will still allow for extra places as the Returning Officer sees fit.

Background on the debate was sought by a councillor for clarification on the issue.



It was explained that the Heads of College presented to the Union and advised that they will not be allowing voter booths on their property at this year's elections. They requested that the regulations change to reflect this.

Questions raised by the Gatton Officer regarding Gatton polling times and voter turn-out.

The UQ Union President responded that the Union will be addressing those issues and will communicate more with Gatton regarding the best times for Gatton voting. It was further clarified that the voting booth at the Halls of Residence has not been removed by the discussed amendments.
